We have been busy, but for a very good purpose - we managed to install the actual mezzanine floor structure in the metal workshop in February but it has taken the remaining weeks to complete. First of all, we had Storm Katy to contend with because the roof was also

being replaced, courtesy of the Landlords, Godalming Town Council, and the temporary covering was ripped away and water came in. We had our guardian angel looking after us because the unfinished mezzanine protected the machinery in the metalwork shop, but was not significantly damaged as it was as yet unfinished.

We managed to furnish the new space with a mixture of careful shopping and kind donations of cabinets from supporters. The new space has allowed us to rationalize the other workshops, provide proper rest space for the tutors and the students, install CCTV to monitor what is happening in each workshop and also to protect ourselves from vandalism and burglary out of

hours. It has also enabled us to start teaching other courses, thanks to a donation from Parsons Brinckerhoff, and we are delighted to say that our first candidates have completed their construction drawing BTech module which has been sent off for accreditation.

We were very honoured to have The Lord Lieutenant of Surrey, Michael More Molyneux, attend to officially open

mezzanine floor on 18th May, forgoing the traditional



ribbon cutting and successfully sawing through a piece of ribbon bedecked wood!. Thank you Michael - a sterling job, conducted with humour and with many kind words of support.

We hosted just a few people to this event as space was limited, but were very pleased to have the donors of the funds present, and so able to thank them publicly. The Surrey Advertiser printed an article about the event on page 2 of the 27th May edition.
