What's been happening?

Skillway has had an excellent start to the year. We have increased the number of schools involved with us as despite the pressure on their budgets the schools recognize that what we have to offer is vital for some of their pupils. We have also welcomed a number of new Home Educated students who may face similar difficulties to those in schools, but also who do not have access to the practical skills that we can offer training in.

A number of our students are finishing with us this term. Some have only been with us a short while whilst others have stayed the course and have been with us for 2 years or more. It doesn't matter how long or short a time they are here the skills that they learn stand them in really good stead for facing the outside world and for becoming part of the working world.

One of our volunteers commented :

'We nearly always view it that we as volunteers are here to help the youngsters. How often do we take the time the think about how it benefits us?

My involvement has helped me to understand people better, to be more sympathetic to all, more tolerant, etc.'

As well as volunteering in the workshops we are also looking for people to get involved in other ways. Some examples of the types of role involved are:

- Helping to organize/attend functions which will promote Skillway eg quiz nights/fetes/ shows/craft fairs
- Helping to raise awareness of Skillway through articles in local magazines and newspapers, giving presentations to organisations that might be interested—eg WI, U3A
- Helping to monitor and update our website so that it provides an accurate reflection of what we are doing.
- You may also have other ideas—this list is not exhaustive—we are open to all suggestions as to how we can promote the work that we do.

As we go in to the summer holidays our volunteers and staff will be finishing with a training day to ensure that we are up to speed with all the necessary frameworks for a new academic year in September.

Home Education

After several years of supporting just a couple of home educated students within our regular programme, it has recently been recognised that this is a community that we can help. The students still fit our criteria as they are young people who require extra support that is not available to them in the main stream school environment.

From September we have been able to offer an exclusive day for home educated students which will give them an opportunity to access practical skill based education. An added advantage for this particular cohort is that they will also have the chance to mix with other home educated students. This will help them to develop friendships and to learn to work alongside others.

Vivien Gillman has been involved with Skillway for over 10 years. Earlier this year she stepped down as CEO due to a house move but we are delighted that she has simply changed title and is now one of our Trustees and is still very much involved with Skillway. We are also delighted that her dedication to Skillway, as part of the Christian Warehouse Trust and her other charity involvement has been rewarded with a Mayors Volunteer Award from the outgoing Mayor Nick Williams. This award goes a small way to recognise the many, many hours that Vivien puts in to helping others. We are so grateful to have Vivien on the Skillway team as her dedication and hard work ensure that we continue to go from strength to strength.

AQA CERTIFICATES & BTEC QUALIFICATIONS

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We have had another successful year. All of our students who have been with us for a minimum of a term have gained AQA certification and/or Btec qualifications. Over

the last 2 years we have given out over 400 AQA certificates to our students recognising their achievements in their practical workshop projects. We continue to add new modules on a regular basis in order to help the students gain as many certificates as possible which in turn builds up a recognition of their skills.



BTEC—all the portfolios we submitted have been passed. Unfortunately 4 students were unable to complete their projects in time. 9 students have the full qualification and the 4 will still have attained one unit.
